


## Complete Streets Survey - Prioritizing What We Want

February 17 -March 28, 2025 – 409 responses


**Tell us about your connection to Wellesley. 409 responses**



**How often do you walk, bike, drive or ride in a car to get around Wellesley?**




**How often do you take the MBTA Commuter Rail from a Wellesley station?**






**How do you usually get to/from the commuter rail station?**

(129 said they rode the commuter rail at least once a week)




## School-aged students in household

**What are the top FIVE desired destinations you would like to walk or bike to?**




**Are there other destinations in Wellesley or just outside of Wellesley that you want to walk or bike to? (Bolded indicates common response)**

## When building new sidewalks, should the Town prioritize sidewalks on streets currently with no sidewalks on either side over streets that have sidewalk on one side?




## What does it depend on?


### How important is on-street parking to you when shopping or dining in Wellesley?
